THE AMERICAN LEGION DEPARTMENT OF MAINE CALLS ON THE LEADERSHIP OF MAINE VETERANS' HOMES TO FIX THE CHALLENGES OR TO STEP DOWN

The American Legion Department of Maine considers it irresponsible that The Maine Veterans' Homes considered closing the Machias and Caribou homes.

We, as a veteran's organization, have lost confidence in the CEO of Maine Veterans' Homes based upon these actions and the way they were handled.

The Maine Veterans' Homes system was created by an act of the Legislature in 1977, a system of six homes geographically placed to support an aging veterans population in the state of Maine, it is imperative that Maine keeps these homes viable in our opinion.

The American Legion Department of Maine sincerely appreciates those who have stepped in and offered support of the Machias and Caribou veterans' homes with deeds instead of words. We now ask that all involved move forward and make them viable for future generation of Maine's veterans.

The MVH CEO and board, in our opinion, were put in place is to lead the operation of the homes, keep them open, and keep them viable.

There were three concerns raised by the Maine Veterans' Homes leadership: Funding, staffing, and declining veteran population, which we wish to address.

- Funding: Thanks to Governor Janet Mills and Senate President Troy Jackson, it appears we have a start in turning around the funding challenges. Members of the Congressional delegation are standing by as well, according to recent meetings with our Department Legislative Committee.
- Staffing: The MVH must be creative in attracting staff. Offer incentives, educational assistance, and/ or more competitive wages. This is not a challenge specific to Maine Veterans' Homes; it has been an ongoing result of the COVID pandemic lockdowns and will take a creative approach to resolve.
- Veteran Population: We have an aging veteran population in Maine who may need these services in the very near future. A 2020 estimate shows Maine has 109,557 veterans. 50% of these veterans are over 65 years of age (55,214 estimated). Aroostook has an estimated 7,800 veterans and

Washington County has an estimated 3,800 veterans with 50% possibly needing services. The next demographic of veterans appears to be the Vietnam veterans. These veterans were treated poorly during the war, shutting down needed homes is another slap in the face to these veterans. Not to mention an aging 9-11 veteran population.

It took decades, and the support of Maine's Veterans Service Organizations, to open the six homes; which include Caribou and Machias. With their closure we will be facing a need with no options left to help our veterans. When future veterans need help, we will not have decades to get new homes built and operating.

Maine Veteran Homes has a mission of caring for those who served, in our opinion, to run these homes, keep them viable, and operational; we think closure contradicts that mission.

We are asking the Governor, the Legislature, Maine's Congressional delegation in Washington D.C., our brothers and sisters in Maine's Military Service Organizations, and the general public to support The American Legion Department of Maine's call to impress upon the MVH leadership to keep these homes open and viable, or to step down.

Warning Signs of Mental Health Need

- Cleaning a souvenir weapon
- Visiting graveyards
- Obsession with news coverage of the war, or the military channel
- Wearing uniform off duty •
- Being overprotective of children •
- Standing guard of the house, obsessively locking doors and windows
- Stopping or hoarding medication ٠
- Hoarding alcohol •
- Defensive speech: "You wouldn't understand"
- Avoiding eye contact

Be Smart About Mental Health

Depression, PTSD, Bipolar, substance use disorder: these and other mental health conditions are serious illnesses, and are serious illnesses that warrant support and treatment. No combat necessary: more than half of military suicides involve soldiers who have never been deployed. If you think you may be depressed, talk to a mental health professional — the sooner you treat the illness, the faster you'll recover. If you are worried about someone, assume you are the only one who will reach out, and encourage them to get treatment.

Suicide Warning Signs

Talk

If a person talks about:

- Killing themselves
- Having no reason to live
- Being a burden to others

Mood

People who are considering suicide often display one or more of the following moods.

- Depression
- Anxiety • Loss of interest
 - Irritability • Fatigue

• Humiliation

• Agitation

• Rage

Behavior

Behaviors that may signal risk, especially if related to a painful event, loss, or change.

- Increased use of alcohol or drugs
- Looking for a way to kill themselves, such as searching online for materials or means
- Withdrawing from activities •
- Isolating from family and friends •
- Sleeping too little or too much •
- Visiting or calling people to say goodbye •
- Giving away prized possessions
- Aggression •

If a friend tells you they are thinking about killing themselves, take it seriously.

Someone considering suicide is experiencing a lifethreatening health crisis and may not believe they can be helped. Work with them to keep them safely away from lethal means like firearms and drugs, and remind them that their suffering is temporary. Stay with them and call the Military & Veteran Crisis Line: 1-800-273-8255.

Be sure to follow up with them after the crisis to see how they're doing.

Paid-Up-For-Life (PUFL) Agreement

- 1. The applicant must be in good standing.
- National Headquarters reserves the right to require further information or confirmation of the member's eligibility, which
 may include a request for the member to provide a copy of his/her DD214 (or similar) or other documentation of age, military
 service or membership eligibility. The member's Paid-Up-For-Life application will be held pending verification.
- The member's Post will be notified of the new PUFL membership and will be permitted up to 30 days to challenge the application for acceptance.
- If payment is being made using a credit card, the full payment will be charged immediately. Payment can be made by MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express.
- 5. The permanent (plastic) PUFL card will be issued within 4-6 weeks of receipt and approval of the application.
- 6. No refund of payment(s) will be made if the member chooses to discontinue his/her PUFL membership at any time, once the application is approved and processed; the only exceptions are explained in Item 7. This also pertains to members participating in the Time Payment Plan whose account was closed due to delinquency. These members will not be eligible to participate in the Time Payment Plan in the future but may re-submit an application with <u>full payment</u> at any time. (Any funds previously submitted on the cancelled account <u>will not</u> be credited to the new application.)
- 7. Should a PUFL member hold membership in a Post whose charter has been canceled and no other Post is available to accept a transfer, then the unused portion of the original fee, if any, will be refunded. The same rule will apply in the event that the member is expelled from membership by action of his Post or Department Headquarters. Except as stated, no refund of any portion of PUFL membership fees paid to National will be made at any time.
- 8. Once the application is processed by National Headquarters, the member will no longer receive renewal notices and his/her subscription to *The American Legion Magazine* will never expire. The member will be automatically renewed each year and his/her annual membership card will be mailed around July 1st to the member's address on record at National Headquarters.

Additional Terms for Time Payment Plan Participants ONLY

- Current members of The American Legion may use the Time Payment Plan to purchase a Paid-Up-For Life (PUFL) membership through National Headquarters. No Interest or service charge is added.
- After receipt and approval of the application at National Headquarters, the remaining balance will be divided into 11 equal monthly payments.
 - National Headquarters will bill the credit card account provided by the member each month in the amount of 1/12 of the total Paid-Up-For-Life fee.
 - It is the responsibility of the member to contact the PUFL Specialist at 800-433-3318 to report a new credit card expiration date prior to the expiration of the card information originally provided.
 - If the member wants to change the credit card account used at any time after the application is submitted to National Headquarters, the member must contact the PUFL Specialist at 800-433-3318 to provide the replacement credit card information.
- 3. The total PUFL membership fee must be paid within 12 months after the application is processed at National and consecutive monthly payments are to be maintained. Delinquent accounts may be closed with or without notice to the member. A delinquency will occur if the member's credit card payment is declined for any reason. Any payments already made will be forfeited; no refunds will be issued if a Time Payment account is closed for any reason.
- 4. The member can elect to pay more than the minimum each month; much the same as a credit card account, paying in advance, or more than the minimum, simply means the account is paid off earlier. To increase the monthly payment amount billed to the member's credit card, the member must contact the PUFL Specialist at 800-433-3318.
- The permanent (plastic) PUFL membership card will be issued only after the total PUFL fee is paid-in-full. If annual cards are issued before the fee is paid-in-full, the member will receive an annual card with the notation of "TIME PAY."
