100 MILES FOR HOPE CHALLENGE INFORMATION

To: All Legion Leadership From: Dan Wheeler, National Adjutant

I wanted to direct your attention to a new challenge as part of this year's 100 Miles for Hope that allows members to support their departments while raising funds for the Veterans & Children Foundation. The national commander wanted to expand the Department Breakout Challenge for the entire duration of the 100 Miles for Hope challenge, which ends Sept. 5.

Here's how it works:

- Proceeds from registrations and donations go directly to the V&CF. If you haven't already registered, visit <u>www.legion.org/100miles</u> to register and learn more.
- For the breakout challenge, departments are divided up into categories by size. You can find out which category your department is in **by visiting the FAQ page here**.
- The department in each category that raises the most money for the V&CF via the 100 miles challenge will receive a plaque from the national commander.
- To ensure that your fundraising gets credited to your department, **you must join its team.** There are two ways to join or support a department or team.
 - 1. Make a donation. To donate to your department, download this PDF to find your department. Then either click the link to go to your department donation page, or text your unique department code to 71777. After texting your department code, you will receive a link to donate to your department.
 - 2. **Fundraise.** Go to Mobile Cause to sign up and then choose "Become a fundraiser" then select a team. All of the departments have already been created. To join a team after initial set-up, log back into **your Mobile Cause page** or type in app.mobilecause.com/vf/100MFH/YourName and select edit at the bottom of the page, then click Join a Team.

Additionally, I wanted to share some resources with you to help promote this great program. Those include:

Promotional materials. National headquarters staff has created promotional items for participants to share. For example, there is a poster that can be displayed at your post, community center or elsewhere. Additionally, there is a small handout card with a QR code that can be given to someone to sign up or donate on the spot, or used as a leavebehind at a meeting. Visit legion.org/100miles/tools for these and other promotional items.

Share your story. The American Legion encourages all participants to share their 100 Miles for Hope journey. A few ways to do this is by sharing your progress and fundraising achievements on the Legiontown web page. And for social media posts, use the hashtag #100MilesForHope. Tag The American Legion and staff will help share your progress.

Facebook shares. An American Legion member has graciously volunteered to create personalized social media graphics that you can share on Facebook and other social media sites. All you need to do is send an email to her with a photo, and she will create one for you. Learn more at legion.org/100miles/share.

Create your own team. It is also possible for American Legion districts, posts or other entities that would like to create their own challenge against another group. For example, two posts, districts, or Riders chapters could create their own challenge. If you would like to create a new team, please email donorservices@legion.org.

Students are elected to various offices. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, and recreational programs. The two representatives elected to represent Maine at Boys Nation in Washington, of federal government.

The American Legion Oratorical Contest exists to develop deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Since 1938, the program has presented participants with an academic speaking challenge that teaches important leadership qualities, the history of our nation's laws, the ability to think and speak clearly, and an understanding of the duties, responsibilities, rights and privileges of American citizenship.

All these programs help to train and shape our youth into outstanding citizens. Many will become our future leaders and many may become leaders in the American Legion.

I am asking all of you: Legionnaires, Legion Posts, and Districts to please contribute to this endowment fund. It will help so many for many years to come.

Any amount will help, but some have asked for specific amounts.

Earth Day April 22

Earth Day is an annual event celebrated around the world on April 22 to demonstrate support for **environmental protection.** First celebrated in 1970, it now includes events in more than 193 countries.

Earth Day was the brainchild of Sen. Gaylord Nelson of Wisconsin, a staunch environmentalist who hoped to provide unity to the grassroots environmental movement and increase ecological awareness.

Nelson—whose efforts in Congress included legislation protecting the Appalachian Trail and banning DDT—hired Denis Hayes, a Harvard grad student. Together they organized the first Earth Day.

Today, Earth Day is widely recognized as **the largest secular observance** in the world, marked by more than a billion people every year as a day of action.

Many important environmental events have happened on Earth Day since 1970, including the signing of the Paris Agreement.

The first Earth Day was **focused on the United States.** In 1990, Hayes, the original national coordinator in 1970, took it international and organized events in 141 nations.

Thanks largely to the momentum created by Earth Day, the early 1970s saw the passage of the most important environmental legislation in US history, including both the Clean Air and Clean Water acts.

Basic Tasks for Creating a Powerpoint Presentation

PowerPoint presentations work like slide shows. To convey a message or a story, you break it down into slides. Think of each slide as a blank canvas for the pictures and words that help you tell your story.

When you open PowerPoint, you'll see some built-in themes and templates. A theme is a slide design that contains matching colors, fonts, and special effects like shadows, reflections, and more.

- 1. On the **File** tab of the Ribbon, select **New**, and then choose a theme. PowerPoint shows you a preview of the theme, with four color variations to choose from on the right side.
- 2. Click Create, or pick a color variation and then click Create.
- 3. On the **Home** tab, click the bottom half of **New Slide**, and pick a slide layout.

Save Your Presentation

- 1. On the File tab, choose Save.
- 2. Pick or browse to a folder.
- 3. In the **File name** box, type a name for your presentation, and then choose **Save**.

Add text

Select a text placeholder and begin typing.

Format Your Text

- 1. Select the text.
- 2. Under **Drawing Tools**, choose **Format**. Do one of the following:
 - To change the color of your text, choose **Text Fill**, and then choose a color.
 - To change the outline color of your text, choose **Text Outline**, and then choose a color.
 - To apply a shadow, reflection, glow, bevel, 3-D rotation, a transform, choose **Text Effects**, and then choose the effect you want.

Add Pictures

On the **Insert** tab, do one of the following:

- 1. To insert a picture that is saved on your local drive or an internal server, choose **Pictures**, browse for the picture, and then choose **Insert**.
- 2. To insert a picture from the web, choose **Online Pictures**, and use the search box to find a picture.
- 3. Choose a picture, and then click **Insert**.

Add Shapes

You can add shapes to illustrate your slide.

- 1. On the **Insert** tab, select **Shapes**, and then select a shape from the menu that appears.
- 2. In the slide area, click and drag to draw the shape.

Select the **Format** or **Shape Format** tab on the ribbon. Open the **Shape Styles** gallery to quickly add a color and style (including shading) to the selected shape.

Add Speaker Notes

Slides are best when you don't cram in too much information. You can put helpful facts and notes in the speaker notes, and refer to them as you present.

- 1. To open the notes pane, at the bottom of the window, click **Notes**.
- 2. Click inside the **Notes** pane below the slide, and begin typing your notes.
