#### **MEMO**

TO: All Legion Leadership

FROM: Kevin Bartlett, National Judge Advocate

RE: LEGION Act Passage and Organizational Implications

President signs ACT

(INDIANAPOLIS, July 30, 2019) -- The head of the nation's largest veterans organization thanked President Trump for signing a bipartisan act which will recognize veterans who served during periods not previously considered "wartime."

The Let Everyone Get Involved In Opportunities for National Service Act (LEGION Act) opens the door for millions of veterans to access American Legion programs and benefits for which they previously had not been eligible

The LEGION Act will amend our Charter to read: "36 USC Section 21703 – Membership: An individual is eligible for membership in the corporation [The American Legion] only if the individual – (1) has served in the Armed Forces of (A) the United States at any time during – (i) the period of April 6, 1917, through November 11, 1918; or (ii) any time after December 7, 1941; or (B) a government associated with the United States Government during a period or time referred to in subclause (A) of this clause and was a citizen of the United States when the individual entered that service; and (2) was honorably discharged or separated from that service or continues to serve honorably during or after that period or time."

Additionally our Charter will be amended to add the following clause: "36 USC Section 21704A – Nondiscrimination: The requirements for holding a staff position in the corporation [The American Legion] may not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex or national origin."

The Constitution of The American Legion, Article XVII states: "In the event the Congress of the United States shall amend the eligibility clause in the Act creating The American Legion, this Constitution shall be deemed amended in conformance therewith, but subject to all consistent limitations and restrictions in this Constitution contained."

Now if, and when, President Trump signs into law the LEGION Act, Article IV, Section 1 of Constitution of The American Legion shall be immediately changed to read: "An individual is eligible for membership in The American Legion only if the individual – (1) has served in the Armed Forces of (A) the United States at any time during – (i) the period of April 6, 1917, through November 11, 1918; or (ii) any time after December 7, 1941; or (B) a government associated with the United States Government during a period or time referred to in subsection (A) of this section and was a citizen of the United States when the individual entered that service; and (2) was honorably discharged or separated from that service or continues to serve honorably during or after that period or time; provided, however, that such service shall have been terminated by honorable discharge or honorable separation, or continued honorably during or after any of said periods; provided, further, that no person shall be entitled to membership who, being in such service during any of said periods, refused on conscientious, political or other grounds to subject themselves to military discipline or unqualified service."

Additionally Article XIII, Section 2 shall be immediately changed to read: "Membership in The American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of The American Legion, and to the grandmothers, mothers, sisters, wives, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during any of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941; or who, being citizens of the United States at the time of their entry therein, served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during any of said periods, and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge; and to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion."

Therefore all properly documented eligible members for The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion will be accepted immediately by the National Organization and processed in the normal manner. It is recommended that, until the issuance of a new membership application, if the applying member is from a previous undocumented war era they write "Other Conflicts" in the eligibility date section and send it in to their department with the appropriate dues.

Departments are strongly urged to immediately review their respective eligibility dates in their respective Constitutions, media outlets and documents to make the appropriate changes as needed.

Due to the all-encompassing nature of this eligibility date change it should be noted that this change does modify the eligibility dates for the Sons of The American Legion program and American Legion Auxiliary. Both organizations are strongly urged to immediately review their respective eligibility dates in their respective Constitutions, media outlets and documents to make the appropriate changes as needed.





Letters reaching every man who has been in the service of the United States from April 8, 1917, to Nov. 11, 1918 have been sent to see who among them are interested in starting a local branch of the American Legion. The meeting will be held on Thursday evening at eight o'clock. It is expected that all service- men, whether they served on this side or across, will be there to become charter members of the Legion. This Legion is based some-what on the G.A.R. that is...in having both city or town that can boast of having World War veterans.

Membership Report for 26 July 2019: We have 2,565 members for 98.28% membership. We are still 48 members shy of being a 100% Detachment. <u>Squadron Membership Teams</u>, go over that roster again. <u>Give those unpaid guys a call or a visit. State officers. Call up those squadrons that haven't made the 100% Club, yet. Give them some help. Guys, this must be a team effort.</u> Come on guys! 48 more to make Maine S. A. L. 100% Membership! Our National Convention starts August 23rd! Your pride is on the line!


