Subject: Naming of New VA Veterans Burial Ground National Cemetery near Machias, Maine

To whom it may concern;

VA National Cemetery Administration (NCA) has acquired land in Jonesboro, Maine, near Machias, for a new veterans burial ground national cemetery, and the cemetery planning and design process is currently getting underway. You are receiving this letter because NCA is actively collecting cemetery name suggestions from the local and regional veteran and military community. Here is NCA guidance regarding name suggestions for national cemeteries that are being newly established.

Consistent with section 531 of title 38, United States Code, a VA facility, structure or real property cannot be named for anything other than the geographic area in which it is located, unless Congress passes a specific law to that effect.

- a. National cemeteries may be named only for the geographic area in which the facility is located. Names for new national cemeteries will be based on three criteria:
- (1) The name helps identify the location of the cemetery site;
- (2) The name has broad appeal to the veteran population; and
- (3) The name provides a positive impression through its relation to history, region, community, or other notable geographic features (lake, river, mountain, etc.).
- b. Responsibility for naming a new national cemetery rests with VA Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs. NCA is required to do the following:
- (1) Collect and coordinate name suggestions from various sources;
- (2) Evaluate proposed names against the criteria
- (3) Prepare a decision document with recommendations and background for review by the Deputy Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs, and submission to the VA Under Secretary for Memorial Affairs;

Any cemetery name suggestion you may choose to submit must first and foremost help to nationally identify the location, while also having broad appeal to the veteran population, and providing a positive impression through its relation to history, region, community, or other notable geographic features. The name suggestion should typically include the words "National Cemetery", for example "Machias National Cemetery".

Does your group have any cemetery name suggestion to submit for NCA consideration? If so, please submit those name suggestions within the next 45 days. I look forward to hearing from you regarding your group's top preference(s) for the cemetery name.

EMPLOYER OF VETERANS AWARD

<u>History</u>: In 1969, the National Economic Commission expanded its Employer Awards Program by including employers of veterans. In 1992, the number of awards for employers of veterans was increased. Today, Departments may submit **one** nomination each for small companies with 50 or fewer employees, medium sized companies with work forces of 51 to 200, and large companies with 201 or more employees.

These three awards, one in each of the three employer of veterans size categories, are presented at the National Convention. In order to be eligible for the Employer of the Year Awards, nominees must meet the following criteria:

- 1) At least 10 percent of the employer's work force must be veterans.
- 2) The employer must have been in business for at least five years.
- 3) The employer cannot restrict employment to veterans only.
- 4) The nominee must be a private sector employer. In other words, the nominee cannot be a city, state or federal employer.

<u>Deadline</u>: Submission of nominations in the Employer of the Year Award category should be submitted to Department Headquarters by **December 30**.

<u>Procedure</u>: Nominations must be sent to Department Headquarters. The Department then selects one nominee (in each category) as its winner. It then forwards the nomination form for the winning employer to the National Economic Commission. That nomination form must be signed by the Department Adjutant.

Only those nominations that include adequate documentation on the nominee's employment practices concerning veterans will be considered for the awards. It is recommended that you provide a copy of the company's written policy on employment of veterans, if available, a description of how the employer supports veterans' activities in the community, and any other reasons why the nominee should be selected to be the winner.

<u>Nomination Form</u>: A copy of the official nomination form is at the end of this newsletter. Posts may reproduce this form for wider distribution. 


