

This year over 35 (and counting) Veteran visual artists, creative writers, musicians, dancers and dramatic readers from VA Maine have entered their art into the Local competition. Veterans who are awarded 1st place in their category at the local competition qualify to compete against Veterans from all across the Nation. VA Maine has participated in the Creative Arts Festival for over 11+ years. The Maine American Legion Auxiliary has helped sponsor the local Competition since 2013. Across the country each year, Veterans treated at VA facilities compete in both local

and national creative arts competitions that provide them with an opportunity to gain recognition for their artistic accomplishments. These competitions includes more than 53 art categories that range from oil painting to leatherwork and even paint-by-number kits. In addition, there are 120 categories pertaining to all aspects of music, dance, drama and creative writing. The creative writing division is a more recent addition to the competition and includes original works in poetry, essay, short story, and personal experience writing. Our local competition is a pre-cursor to the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival. Last year VA Maine sent five Veterans to the National festival in Mississippi. We also had one artist that placed third in her division at the national level. The American Legion Auxiliary has actively supported this event nationwide since 2000. Founded in 1919, the American Legion Auxiliary is the world's largest women's patriotic service organization.

**Purpose**: To submit nomination(s) for the Canadian Friendship Award.

**Conditions**: It shall be awarded to specific individuals who shall be war veterans within the accepted meaning of the term and members of an authentic veteran's organization in Canada.

The award shall be given to individuals in recognition of outstanding service in the field of veterans' affairs and in the development and perpetuation of the spirit of international goodwill and comradeship between The United States and Canada and between their veterans' organization and The American Legion.

Nominations may be made by any member of The American Legion in good standing, under such rules and regulations as shall be approved for such award.

**Nominations**: Receipt of award is limited to one (1) per branch and nominations are limited to one (1) per post.

**Documentation**: Each nomination shall be thoroughly documented (testimonials and other credentials, newspaper clippings, copies of awards, etc.) by the person placing the name in nomination. If space on the nomination form is insufficient, additional pages may be attached for consideration.

The nominator will be responsible for making definite time/place/presentation plans, subject to approval of the nominee for the award.

**Deadline**: Nominations <u>must</u> reach Department Headquarters by February 15.

#### An American Legion Challenge

Top leaders in all of tomorrow's activities will come from today's college students. Among them will be those who have increased their chances for success even more by enrolling in the Reserve Officers Training Corps. They will gain the ability to lead and inspire others to follow. ROTC develops these qualities. The American Legion has a challenge to encourage these young Americans to help their country, and to prepare themselves for positions of leadership.

The American Legion ROTC Medal Awards were established by National Convention mandate as a way in which The American Legion could show its support. Participation in this project can be worthy community service and a credit to The American Legion.

Many Posts have "ADOPTED" a nearby ROTC unit and are presenting these medals annually. Some Departments are presenting medals to ALL ROTC units within their states. Many Posts have presented a complete, framed set of Legion ROTC medals for permanent display in the school Day Room.

If you have a nearby school with an ROTC unit, and have not already "ADOPTED" it, do so NOW!! Discuss this matter at your next Post meeting. This is a worthy project and should be done on an annual basis. In communities where there are more than one Post..... make it a joint project. Why not establish your contact with the schools NOW!! Pick up the telephone and call the college president, the high school principal or the Professor of Military /Naval Science or Aerospace Studies.

The medals and ribbon bars have been approved for wear by the Department of Defense and Departments of Army, Navy and Air Force. Criteria for these decorations have been also officially approved and are published in each of the Service regulations.

These medals, recognizing Military and Scholastic Excellence, are available for presentation to Army, Navy and Air Force ROTC cadets at any college, university, or high school. These medals come in three forms:

BRONZE-is available for award to students participating in the final year of the Junior (high school) ROTC program and to college students who are satisfactorily participating in the Freshman AS/MS/NS-100 course who have qualified for admission to the 200 course.

SILVER- is available for award to students satisfactorily participating in the Sophomore AS/MS/NS-200 course who have qualified for admission to the Junior 300 course, and to students satisfactorily participating in the Junior AS/MS/NS-300 course.

GOLD-is available for award to students satisfactorily participating in the Junior AS/MS/NS-300 course who have qualified for admission to the Senior 400 course, and to students satisfactorily participating in the Senior AS/MS/NS-400 course.

Recent DOD statistics show that the ROTC program nearly doubles any other officer acquisition program in the military service. Not only is the ROTC Achievement Program an excellent community project, it brings prestige to the Post, the Department, and The American Legion and most important it promotes the National Security of this country.
