# **American Legion Baseball Threatened**

The Baseball Committee recently held its Winter Meeting at HQ in Winslow. As is the custom during that meeting the plans and suggestions posed at the Fall Meeting were further considered and any new developments were discussed.

The most concerning revelation came when the Committee received a report which indicated an insurrection of sorts is fomenting in the greater Portland area.

In Department of Maine American Legion baseball there are two divisions. The Senior division has existed since before most of us can remember. The Junior division has only been around for ten years or so. It was started at the urging of current Zone 3 Commissioner, Al Livingston. He recognized the need for younger players to be more actively involved. They were becoming increasingly impatient riding the bench waiting for their chance to play. Many were opting not to play American Legion baseball.

Prior to the Junior program team rosters included players age 18 and younger. (Currently the upper age is 19 years.) Logically, the older players were bigger, stronger and more skilled than the younger ones. This resulted in many younger players being assigned non-playing roles which resulted in declining interest and participation by those players. Livingston thought, and the Committee agreed, there should be an opportunity for the younger players to play more regularly, thus honing their skills and gaining the necessary experience and growth to compete at the Senior level. Nationally the Junior program was also being implemented.

Our Junior American Legion program has become very popular. Currently, under the direction and leadership of Junior Legion Commissioner, Rod Stevens, there are 27 teams registered or expressing interest in 2017. With our Junior program at that level, potentially 486 young people will have the opportunity to play American Legion baseball and benefit from the experience of being part of a team. And of course it is expected that by playing at this age and skill appropriated level many will improve sufficiently and compete in our Senior baseball program...making it even stronger.

The organizational structure and sound management of the Junior program is equal to that of the Senior program. Their rules and regulations are essentially identical to those of the Seniors. They are required to carry the same levels of accident and liability insurance, their team rosters are capped at the same level and they require the same strict player documentation as the Seniors. Their team coaches and other team officials who have contact with the players are required to undergo the same background checks as the Seniors. Additionally, the Juniors have a State Tournament to determine the overall champion and that team advances to a regional New England tournament...just like the Seniors.

Many of the teams, Junior and Senior, in Maine are comprised of players from more than one school. The National Rules state that the combined enrollment of all secondary schools in a team's drawing area may not exceed 5000 students in grades 10, 11 & 12.

In the greater Portland area there are at least two coaches who apparently would rather use the Junior program strictly as a feeder program for their own high school baseball programs. They are now actively recruiting other Junior teams in their area to join them in withdrawing from Junior American Legion baseball and forming a league of their own which does not have the same structure, regulation and oversight as does our American Legion baseball program.

It is at best only speculation as to why this effort is underway. Perhaps, as mentioned, they wish to have only players who will play for their high school baseball program on their teams. It is rumored that they only want to play games during the week thus freeing the weekends for the existing for-profit businesses known as 'Travel Baseball' or 'Showcase Baseball' to become more popular. Presumably there will be no cap on the number of players a team can have on its roster, maybe that's to give more people the chance to play. Whatever the reasons, there is little doubt this effort will have an adverse impact on the current Junior American Legion Baseball program in Maine.

My view has always been that American Legion baseball is the best baseball for our youth that is played in Maine during the summer. The purpose of the program is to have as many young people as possible enjoy the opportunity and experience of playing this caliber of baseball. The American Legion teams in Maine are not generally comprised of players from only one school. They are a conglomerate of the best players from numerous schools who want to play on the best baseball team in their area. The result is that friendships are forged, sportsmanship is cultivated and the concept of 'team' and unselfish sacrifice necessary to have a team become greater and more successful than the sum of its individual players is inculcated. These values and life lessons seem to be diminishing in our society today yet remain essential for our future if we are to protect our freedoms and preserve our Union.

I urge American Legion Posts and individual Legionnaires who are affiliated in any way with Junior Legion teams in the Greater Portland area to ask questions regarding this movement. Why are we doing this? Who does it benefit? Is it good for the kids? I know it is not good for American Legion baseball.




