## **MyHealtheVet**

20,000 veterans in Maine are using the VA's My HealtheVet healthcare portal. \*Get started now.

Over half the veterans receiving care at the VA in Maine are using a computer website called MyHealtheVet to access their records, check appointments, order prescriptions, and contact their healthcare team.

"More and more, when I meet a veteran," says the Maine's system coordinator Mike L'Abbe, they are already using My HealtheVet to do any number of things.

"I do get a lot of calls, though, from Vets who may want to know where we have placed a certain feature," he says. Mike, a Navy Veteran, is more than happy to give tours of the site by phone or in person at one of the VA's Maine locations. He can also help veterans who are having problems with logging in or navigating any other part of the site.

For veterans who registered as users long ago, there is an array of features that have been added or streamlined. "Obviously, the big ones are prescription refill and secure messaging, but the e-mail notifications before an appointment or when a prescription ships are the new favorites. Veterans have to turn those reminders on, but it is very easy in their profile section.

To get registered, veterans should visit www.myhealth.va.gov. To use all the advance features a vet must show a picture identification card once to be authenticated at any VA Maine primary care office.

## **Healing Through Horses**

Equine-facilitated psychotherapy (EFP) is an interactive process in which a licensed mental health professional, working with equine professional partners and suitable equine(s), address psychotherapy goals set forth by the mental health professional and the client.

Equine-assisted learning (EAL) is an experiential learning approach that promotes the development of life skills for educational, professional, and personal goals through equine-assisted activities.

HTH's Veterans Healing Through Horses' program provides free scholarships to veterans at attend the seasonal eight-week program. It seeks to foster and create relationships between veterans, horses, and with each other. Additionally, it familiarizes and acquaints veterans with the dynamics that only their horses and their personality can create. This relationship reflects how the veterans' internal unexpressed emotions can have an immediate effect on the horse's behavior and encourages the participants to find solutions to problems by learning to rely on their horse as a partner.


