Today, I want to discuss the POW/MIA monument. As Riders, we wear a POW/MIA patch on our vest. The monument at Department HQ will bear the same insignia on a black granite stone to be located at the top of the monument. This is the only portion not currently funded.

Ladies and gentlemen of the Riders, I am going to make a plea with you. As many of you know, the POW/MIA monument located at Department HQ in Winslow has been paid for in its entirety through the sale of the bricks and donations. This is due to the generosity of many Legion Posts and Auxiliary Units, SAL Squadrons, and Rider Chapters throughout the State of Maine. 480 names will be inscribed on these bricks. These are the names of our brothers who will never see the light of day. The families of these 480 brothers need a place to come, a place to sit, and a place to touch the name of their loved one. What better place than the home of the largest Veterans Organization of the world. An organization that works to helps to repatriate the remains of fallen Americans around the world and represents those that survive. I ask ladies and gentlemen to please donate what you can, for these are our brothers. Let us help to honor them, and more importantly, honor the families who have suffered their loss.

The stone will looked like the patch we wear so proudly and the NEW American Legion Riders sign will hang prominently on the building facing this monument.

Help us cap this monument with the stone that our patch represents. Please donate and make check out to The American Legion, Dept. of Maine, c/o black stone project. 



The talent show does **not** have an actual theme, such as our membership theme or even the USO. Acts do not have to have anything to do with the name of the show. However, acts should be done in a similar manner to what a USO tour was back in the day; good wholesome entertainment that is considerate and entertaining to a broad age audience.

Here are some Do's and Don'ts:

DO's:

- Come up with creative Ideas such as wholesome comedy routines, singing, dancing, acting, impersonations, poetry reading, juggling or some other entertaining talent.
- o Limit your Time: All acts are limited to 5 minutes.
- Practice, Practice! If you are entering the show, please practice your act/routine so that you are prepared. (This is especially important if you have a team or group that is participating. Since we only have about 4 weeks left, planning for practice time will need to be built into your plan)
- o Pay your entry fee prior to the deadline of September 10th. The \$25.00 entry fee **must** be pre-paid with the entry form found in the Chatter.

DON'Ts:

- The talent show is **not** intended to be skits like we see at Mid-Winter Conference. A well-written, entertaining skit is acceptable. A not so talented, thrown together skit is not.
- o There is not a requirement for anyone to participate (Officer, District, etc.). This is a voluntary show so please participate only if you wish to and have a talent you want to share.
- o The talent show is for all members of the Legion Family, not just the Auxiliary. So please remember the audience you will be performing for. All acts should be understandable to the whole audience and should be wholesome in nature.
- o Please do not enter at the last minute. There is prep work needed for the show to be a success hence the deadline for entries of September 10th


